Allegations of land grabbing against Police personnel: HC directs SSP Samba, SHO Vijaypur to submit status of FIR

JAMMU: In a significant order Justice Sushil Kumar of High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh (Jammu Bench) has directed Senior Superintendent of Police, Samba and SHO Police Station, Vijaypur to file status report before the court date of hearing with regard to investigation in FIR No.0001/2019 dated January 6, 2019 registered with Police Station Vijaypur under Section 375(4)(2)/504/506 of IPC against ACP Singh, Inspector J&K Police (presently posted at GPR Badgam, Samba) and Registrar, Singh Head Constable presently posted at Police Line Bhatta. The Court also issued notices to the District Secretary (Home) J&K Government, District General of Police J&K, Inspector General of Police Jammu and Registrar, Singh Head Constable presently posted at Police Line Bhatta. The Court directed that the status report should be filed without any political intervention. When the petition came up for hearing, Advocate Rajesh Malik with Advocate Sushil Singh Chandel appearing for petitioner submitted that the petitioner is a retired Master from School Education Department and in possession of land measuring 15 Kanal 66 Marls falling under Khata No. 1460 and 15 Kanal 92 Marls in Khata No. 1296 non-jointly with co-tenant Gopal Singh situated at Village Bugh (Bhatra), Bhatra Vijaypur District Samba.

Advocate R M Malik further submitted that on April 1, 2017 Sub Inspector ACP Singh then posted as Lane Officer at DPL Jammu and Head Constable Registrar Singh trespassed into aforementioned land of petitioner at Bhatra at about 11:30 AM and forcibly took the land into possession. The whole incident has been photographed and video-graphed but both police personnel tried to grab land of the petitioner and were caught on camera. Advocate Malik further submitted that both police personnel are arrested in bail deals and the land in dispute has been

under Section 51(b) of CrP.C. FIR No.0001/2019 dated January 6, 2019 came to be registered against accused after the passage of several months.

Advocate Malik further submitted that since January, 2019 there is no hearing in the investigation as local police is under influence of police accused who is a real brother-in-law of an Deputy Chief Minister. He stated that Advocate Malik further submitted that Investigating Officer and field revenue staff are just exchanging letters for circumvention of the output land and the petitioner has completely lost hope of getting FIR. ACP Singh has been promoted to the next higher rank of Inspector. He further submitted that no departmental action was initiated by higher authorities under Police Manual against both accused in view of their access to the records of police.

Harnessing Renewable Energy

Jammu and Kashmir, a union territory rich in natural resources, has taken significant steps towards harnessing renewable energy for sustainable development. With the allocation of Rs. 109.86 crore under capital expenditure for Science and Technology in 2023-24, the UT aims to install solar and hydro power projects, establish innovation centers and demonstration farms, and provide financial support for research and development projects. Under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Ujya Suraksha evam Utthasan Mahabhyan, around 9000 solar agriculture pumps will be installed or replaced with an installed capacity of 90 megawatts. This initiative will not only reduce the dependence on fossil fuels but also help farmers in the region to reduce their energy bills. The Jammu Solar City Project aims to achieve a total of 200 megawatts of rooftop solar power plants, out of which 80 megawatts will be installed in 2023-24. This initiative will benefit around 20,000 households in the region, reducing their carbon footprint and contributing to the national goal of increasing the share of renewable energy in the energy mix. Under the Rooftop Solar Power Plants for domestic sector funded by the Ministry of New & Renewable Energy, 3000 households will be covered with an installed capacity of 10 megawatts during 2023-24. This initiative will not only help households to reduce their energy bills but also contribute to reducing greenhouse gas emissions. The Srinagar Smart City Project plans to install 3 megawatts of rooftop solar power plants in the city, covering 50 government buildings and 20 other buildings in different districts. The government aims to cover all government buildings in a mission mode, making the city more energy-efficient and contributing to sustainable development. The establishment of an innovation and dissemination center within the premises of the Sub-Regional Science Centre in Lal Marsh, Srinagar, will

- It helped students engage better and get deep insights about lgbtq legal, social, and political issues.



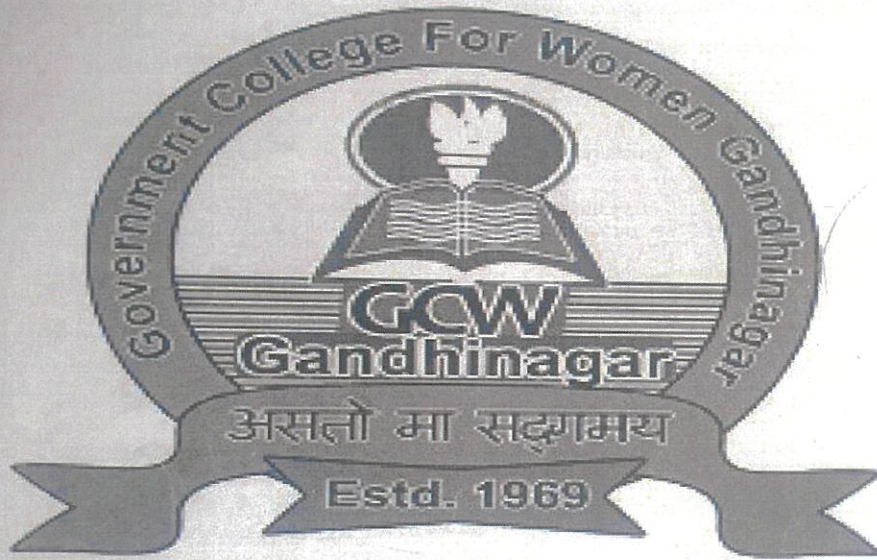

**Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC),

The Institution has a prescribed code of conduct for students, Teachers, Administrators and other staff in tune with the mission and identity of the college.

Code of Conduct for Students

College requires all the students to conduct and express themselves in a way that is respectful to all individuals. Towards this end the college has devised following code of conduct for the students;

1. The identity card with photograph affixed and signed by Principal must be mandatory for the student while in the campus.
2. Student should be regular and punctual in attending classes, tutorials and assignments as per the timetable.
3. Student should have minimum 75% attendance in the lectures of every subject otherwise he or she will be debarred from university exam.
4. A very high standard of discipline, regularity and punctuality is expected from the student.
5. Students are required to check all the notices and circulars displayed on the notice board and website of the college.
6. The conduct of the student in the premises of the college as well as in their classes should be satisfactory.
7. Students are required to follow the dress code prescribed by the college.
8. Use of mobile phones and other electronic devices that disrupts teaching learning environment is strictly prohibited in the college premises.
9. Any kind of ragging within the college campus is strictly prohibited. Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the college.
10. Student must not falsify information to a faculty member or college official and must not indulge in hostile behaviour.
11. Student must not bring any outsider who is not enrolled on the college premises.
12. Student must appear in all the class tests and examinations.
13. Students are supposed to attend national functions and various other activities organised by college.

In violation of this code the disciplinary measures imposed include;

- a. Written warning or reprimand
- b. Loss of certain privileges.
- c. Fine or loss of fees.
- d. Suspension or expulsion.

Rules for Parking

1. All vehicles should be parked in the parking area provided by the college.
2. A vehicle should be properly locked and parked.
3. Last Friday of every month will be no vehicle day.

Examinations Rules

1. Student must appear for all Internal as well as University examination.
2. Student must read the timetable of examination displayed on notice board carefully and check regularly the changes made in timetable if any.
3. Student must be present in the examination hall 20 minutes before the start of examination.
4. Student cannot enter the examination hall if he or she is late by half an hour.
5. Student cannot enter an examination hall more than half an hour after the start of examination.
6. Students are not allowed to carry any kind of study material, mobile phone with them during exam.
7. The student should obey the instructions given by supervisor in the examination hall.
8. Student must not leave the class until all answer books are collected by the supervisor.

General Library Rules

To provide a safe and secure learning environment to the students in the library, college has established certain guidelines for appropriate behaviour.

1. Students are expected to behave in a civil manner that doesn't interfere with other people using this facility.
2. Every student entering the Library must present his/her own Identity Card as well as Library card to library authorities.
3. Students are advised not to keep any personal items in their Identity Card.
4. Misusing, destroying, defacing and stealing or damaging library property is strictly prohibited and indulging in any of these acts may result in the withdrawal of privileges.
5. CDs or any other accompanying materials available with books may be viewed /used only in the library.
6. Readers shall not write or mark (by underlining, putting brackets, etc.) on the reading materials. The Library property and furniture is to be handled with utmost care.
7. Students should maintain silence in the Library.
8. Students borrowing books must return them on time and in the same condition as when borrowed.
9. Reference Material (Newspaper/Current Periodicals) will be issued only to the students for use only in the Library.
10. If a book is lost by a student, he/she should replace it with a new copy of the same or pay the cost of the book to the library.
11. The loss of Identity card should be reported immediately to the Librarian in writing and duplicate Identity card will be issued with fine.
12. Eatables and beverages are not allowed in the library premises.

- 13. Smoking, spitting, eating, loud conversation and similar objectionable practices are prohibited in or near the Library.
- 14. Use of Mobile Phones and musical instruments are prohibited within the library premises.
